

## Home Learning Weeks 3 & 4

Age Range: Year 1

Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Play on <a href="#">Hit the Button</a> - number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables.</li><li>• Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. This <a href="#">game</a> could support this.</li><li>• Practise learning about money by playing with coins. You can use real coins and play 'shop' with family members.</li><li>• Go out in the garden and observe the different creatures/animals that can be seen. Count how many of each animal/creature you can find.</li><li>• Write the numbers 0-20 in words and digits.</li><li>• Practise your calculations – adding and subtracting and finding the missing number in a sum.</li><li>• Practise your number formation, writing digits the right way round.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Read fiction, non-fiction and poems about animals.</li><li>• Read a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book everyday. This can be reading a book aloud everyday or sharing a book with an adult.</li><li>• Listen to a story, <a href="#">Storytime</a>.</li><li>• Create a bookmark with animal facts.</li><li>• Complete a book review on one of the books you have read - what did you like about it? Would you recommend it to anyone?</li><li>• Comprehension – answer questions about the book you have read.</li></ul>
Weekly Phonics/Spellings Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Daily phonics - practise sounds and blends from phases 2-5.</li><li>• Read and write pseudo (alien) and real words using sounds and blends from your phonics mats.</li><li>• Interactive games found on links below.</li><li>• <a href="#">Phonics play</a></li><li>• <a href="#">Top Marks</a></li><li>• <a href="#">Spelling</a></li><li>• <a href="#">Spelling City</a></li><li>• Spell the days of the week.</li><li>• Read and spell common exception words (see sheet)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A-Z animal list. Can you think of an animal for each letter of the alphabet. Can you add sound buttons?</li><li>• Draw a picture of your animal and label it. Can you write sentences using adjectives?</li><li>• Write a set of questions about animals you would like to find out about.</li><li>• Create a fact file about your favourite animal. Research an animal of your choice and explore the vocabulary required to describe them.</li><li>• Describe similarities and differences between animals.</li><li>• Practise your letter formation – lower case and capitals.</li></ul>

### Learning Project - Animals

**Produce your own project about Animals. Your project should include:- writing, pictures and research.**

**The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about key animals they are interested in. Learning may focus on exploring the physical aspects of an animal, their habitat, categorising animals etc.**
