Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play on Hit the Button - focus on and times tables including division. • Complete one Purple Mash Maths task set in your 'Alerts' • Practise the four operations – addition, subtraction, multiplication and division using written methods. • Get a piece of paper and show everything you know about Addition. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. You can be as creative as you want to be. • Practise telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes. • 'Daily 10' timestables on 'Top Marks' 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day. • Read to an adult and discuss what you have read. Remember to read with expression! • An activity to complete on either Classroom Secrets Learning Pack or Twinkl. • Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word? • Look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary you are unfamiliar with. Use a highlighter to highlight in magazines and newspapers and research their definitions.
Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practise the Year 3/4 for Common Exception words. • Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write synonyms, antonyms, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can the word be modified? • Choose 5 Common Exception words and practise spelling them using forwards backwards. Write the word forwards then write the words backwards, e.g. forwards sdrawrof • Complete one spelling quiz on Purple Mash in your 'Alerts' section. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a recount of a book you have read at home. What happens in the story? How does it end? • Write a character description of a member in your family. What do they look like? How do they behave? etc... • Book Review – write a book review about a text you have read. Would you recommend this book? Why? What was your favourite part of the story? How many stars would you give it? • Take part in a writing master class. • Complete one GaPS 'Alert' on your Purple Mash account.

Creative Tasks - to be done throughout the week

- **Postcards of Kindness** – Find a blank postcard in your pack. Decorate the front imaginatively and write to someone in a local care home (See address). Don't forget to post it!
- **Let's Create:**
Choose a building you most admire in our local area. Make a model of that building using materials of your choice. (Playdough, junk modelling, lego etc.....) How well did you do? What would you do differently next time?
