### Year 3

Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Play on <a href="#">Hit the Button</a> - focus on halves, doubles and times tables. .</li> <li>• Complete one purple mash task set in your 'Alerts'</li> <li>• Choose your own numbers and practise addition and subtraction of three digit numbers using the column method .</li> <li>• Get a piece of paper and show everything you know about Money. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. Be as creative as you can.</li> <li>• Get a piece of paper and create some questions using money, you could draw the coins and write some questions adding and subtracting money and finding change. Don't forget to answer them too!</li> <li>• Play on Daily 10 and keep a record of your scores</li> <li>• Answer this question - <i>In 5 days Sophie made 80 sandcastles. Each day she made 4 fewer sandcastles than the day before. How many castles did she make each day?</i></li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day.</li> <li>• Read to an adult and discuss what you have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation.</li> <li>• An activity from the Classroom Secrets or Twinkl learning pack</li> <li>• Explore new vocabulary you find when reading. What are the origins of this word? Can it be modified? Can you find any synonyms or antonyms for your new word?</li> <li>• Look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. Use a highlighter to highlight them and research their definitions .</li> </ul>
Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Practise the Year 3/4 for <a href="#">Common Exception</a> words.</li> <li>• Choose 5 different Common Exception words. Write synonyms, antonyms, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can the word be modified?</li> <li>• Choose 5 different Common Exception words and practise spelling them using forwards backwards. Write the word forwards then write the words backwards, e.g. <b>forwards</b>    <b>sdrawrof</b></li> <li>• Complete one spelling quiz on Purple Mash in your 'Alerts' section</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Write a letter to be sent to local schools explaining why children should support local charities if they can and help those who are in need</li> <li>• Choose a particular food and write an acrostic poem. Think about where it comes from? What does it look like? What does it taste like? Etc...</li> <li>• If they were to become a superhero what would their superpower be? Write a character description of them as a superhero. Explain how they save the day.</li> <li>• Write a letter/email/ text message to a member of your family that they have not seen this week.</li> <li>• Take part in a writing <a href="#">master class</a>.</li> </ul>

### Creative Tasks - to be done throughout the week

**Post cards of a kindness.** Find the blank postcard in your pack. Decorate the front imaginatively and write to someone who maybe feeling lonely. Don't forget to post it!



**Let' Create** – Complete an observational drawing of what you see outside your window. You may wish to go out into a garden and find natural forms such as stones, leaves and flowers. Complete sketches, showing an awareness of different viewpoints of the same object. Remember to concentrate on tone and shading.

Perhaps you could play a board game, Facetime a member of your family you haven't seen this week, enjoy a family indoor picnic or help prepare a family dinner- which you can then enjoy.
