Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete one Purple Mash Maths task set in your 'Alerts' • Playing Games Boardgames and card games involve a lot of different aspects of maths. Play at least three different games and make a note of all the maths you have to use. How many aspects of maths can you find? • Shadow Measuring Explore what happens to the length of your shadow during the day. Use chalk to mark the length of your shadow early in the morning and then at different times during the day. Measure your shadow and create a table for your results. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read to an adult and discuss what you have read. Remember to read with expression! • Readaloud Practise reading a picture book or a part of a longer story with expression. Can you use different voices for each character? You could read to someone else in your home or record yourself. • Character Collage Draw an outline of the main character. Use pictures from magazines or catalogues to fill in the outline. For a real challenge, you could try to fill the outline with pictures and colours that tell me something about the character.
Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practise the Year 3/4 for Common Exception words. • Complete one spelling quiz on Purple Mash in your 'Alerts' section. • Verb Charades List lots of verbs on pieces of scrap paper. Now you have 30 seconds to act out as many verbs as you can to someone else at home. Swap – can they beat your score? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete one GaPS 'Alert' on your Purple Mash account. • Be Inspired by Film There are many sheds to explore if you got to literacyshed.com/home.html Choose a film to watch and then do one of the suggested writing tasks – or come up with your own idea. • Nature Journal Spend some time out in the garden or looking out of your window. What can you see? Look closely and draw something in detail – a bug or a plant or a piece of bark. Now add details and then research to find out more. Write down the information.
Creative Tasks - to be done throughout the week	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Acts of Kindness – Can you help the birds? Maybe you could put some food out to attract birds to your patch. Check out the RSPB website to find recommended and safe food for birds https://www.rspb.org.uk/birds-and-wildlife/advice/how-you-can-help-birds/feeding-birds/safe-food-for-birds/ The website also has a section on bird identification - can you identify the species of bird you can see out of your window? Maybe you could teach your family. • Let's Create - Create a piece of artwork entitled 'Family'. This could be a drawing, a self portrait, a sculpture or collage. Could you use inspiration from another artist's style? Which materials have they chosen to use and why? • Time to Talk - • Perhaps you can play a board game, FaceTime a member of your family, enjoy a family indoor picnic or help to prepare a family dinner – which you can then enjoy! • Keep Moving: Log on to iMoves -www.theimovement.com How many family members can
