Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play on Hit the Button - focus on halves, doubles and times tables. . • Complete one purple mash task set in your 'Alerts' • Choose your own numbers and practise addition and subtraction of three digit numbers using the column method . • Write your own maths quiz for a member of your family using lots of different areas of maths e.g. time, addition and subtraction, times tables etc • Find out some information about different types of angles (right angle, acute angle, obtuse angle) and try and spot some of these angles in your house • Play on Daily 10 and keep a record of your scores • Answer this question – <i>Space monsters have landed on your planet. Some monsters have 2 eyes and some monsters have three eyes. There were 28 eyes all together. How many monsters have 3 eyes? How many have 2 eyes?</i> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You could share a story together. This could be a chapter book where you read and discuss a chapter a day. • Read a different genre of book maybe an information book, comic or newspaper. • An activity from the Classroom Secrets or Twinkl learning pack • Make a word bank while reading a text. It could be an adjective word bank or an exciting language word bank- it's up to you! • Look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. Use a highlighter to highlight them and research their definitions .

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practise the Year 3/4 for Common Exception words. • Choose 5 different Common Exception words. Write synonyms, antonyms, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can the word be modified? • Go to https://spellingframe.co.uk/ pick a spelling rule then click on spelling tiles play any of these activities to practise these spellings. • Complete one spelling quiz on Purple Mash in your 'Alerts' section 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We have just celebrated VE day, research some information and create some pieces of writing around this topic – you could write an information text or a diary entry or even make a poster • Write a recount about one of your walks/trips outside – what could you see, what could you hear etc. • Write an adventure story set in space – be as imaginative as you can. • Take part in a writing master class.
Creative Tasks - to be done throughout the week	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Acts of kindness – Think of an act of kindness you can complete which will support your family and make them smile. Maybe tidying your room, helping with the gardening, offering to help make a meal. • Let's create – Think of your favourite animal and create a piece of art work to represent it. You could draw, paint, make a collage or even make a model of it. You might find a drawing tutorial online or you might choose to focus on particular patterns or colours that relate to that animal. • Time to talk – Why not take this time to get to know your family a bit better? You could create a quiz and ask about favourite foods, colours, places, memories, hobbies etc. You could even Facetime other relatives and find out about them too! • Keep moving - You could have a go at creating your own fitness work out with different activities.
