You must know the answers to the different questions! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to read daily – show your understanding of the text by discussing them with someone at home, or pretending you are leading a vlog book review • Could you really practice reading aloud? Think about your voice, the use of punctuation. Maybe you could record this, listen back and try to improve. Try and read trickier books so you get used to different vocabulary. • Have a go at the different reading games available on Top Marks • An activity from a Classroom Secrets or Twinkl learning pack.
Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practise the Year 5/ 6 Common Exception Words (see list) then choose 5 Common Exception words. You can then write a synonym, antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. • Create a vocabulary bank that could help you with your zoo debate, story writing or letter. • Proofread your writing from the week. Use a dictionary to check the spelling of any words that you have found challenging. • Pick a page from your book and try to find all of the verbs, nouns, adjectives and adverbs. • Try to rewrite a sentence from your book changing the verb, noun, adjective or adverb. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a go at one of the English BBC bitesize lessons • Go to www.thenational.academy/online-classroom and find an English lesson on there • Complete activities from Literacy Shed and your Purple Mash alerts. • Story task: Create a graphic novel (like a comic, or the layout to the Peterloo story we read). Use pictures, speech and some descriptions to tell the story. Again the genre, characters and settings are all your own. If you are struggling – superheroes always create good characters. Could you include a local real life superhero?
Creative tasks - to be done throughout the week	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Acts of kindness – Think of an act of kindness you can complete which will support your family and make them smile. Maybe tidying your room, helping with the gardening, offering to help make a meal. • Let's create – Think of your favourite animal and create a piece of art work to represent it. You could draw, paint, make a collage or even make a model of it. You might find a drawing tutorial online or you might choose to focus on particular patterns or colours that relate to that animal. • Time to talk – Why not take this time to get to know your family a bit better? You could create a quiz and ask about favourite foods, colours, places, memories, hobbies etc. You could even video call other relatives and find out about them too! • Keep moving - You could have a go at creating your own fitness work out with different activities.
