<p>Monday- Share the book “All are welcome” together. It can be found here https://safeyoutube.net/w/C9gL After enjoying it, discuss with your child how people from all around the world are the same and how they are different.</p>	<p>Monday- Our sound of the week is “Mm” Listen to the Jolly Phonics songs https://safeYouTube.net/w/IVHJ Join in the actions and practise saying the sound and writing the sound.</p>
<p>Tuesday- Share the book Here We Are . Talk about the book. What makes our world so special? Build up vocabulary. Talk about the things in our world that you like.</p>	<p>Tuesday- Our sound of the week is “Mm” Go on a sound hunt around your house and garden. How many things can you find beginning with “Mm”? Can you draw some of them and write the sound “m” next to each one?</p>
<p>Wednesday- Share the book “Lost and found” by Oliver Jeffers. It can be found here https://safeYouTube.net/w/EBBL Talk about where in the world the penguin comes from and what it is like there. Is it like Irlam?</p>	<p>Wednesday- Splat the Letter- Write out the letters for the sounds your child has been practising on pieces of paper and spread out on the floor. Take it in turns to shout out a sound and both players have to try and splat the sound with their hand.</p>
<p>Thursday- Share the book “Sharing a shell” by Julia Donaldson. It can be found here ‘Sharing a Shell’ Talk about where in the world the story takes place and what it is like there. Is it like Irlam?</p>	<p>Thursday- Focus on rhyme, make a rhyming list- bat, cat, mat etc . Write the “-at” sound and keep changing the initial sound- you can make real and nonsense words. Write the “-og” sound and keep changing the initial sound-you can make real and nonsense words.</p>
<p>Friday- Share the book “Handa’s Surprise” by Eileen Browne. It can be found here https://safeYouTube.net/w/UHBL Talk about where in the world Handa lives and what it is like there. <p>Monday- Draw a picture of yourself and some of your friends. Write your name under your picture and your friends names under theirs. https://www.doorwayonline.org.uk/activities/letterformation/</p>	<p>Monday- Ask your child to make a simple shape pattern or a colour pattern by visiting String of beads Make your own repeating pattern.</p>
<p>Tuesday- In the story “Here we are” you read about around the world and see the air, land and sea. Can you draw a picture of some of the different things from around the world and label them? It might be buildings, or the environment, or animals.</p>	<p>Tuesday- Go on a walk or into your garden to collect natural objects to make patterns with i.e. stone, flower, stick, stone, flower, stick. Can you make a more complex pattern?</p>
<p>Wednesday- In the story “Lost and found” the penguin and the little boy go on a journey, write a list of things that they would pack in their suitcase to take on their trip.</p>	<p>Wednesday- Look at some different flags from countries around the world flags from around the world Can you see any patterns? What shapes and colours can you see? Do any look similar?</p>

<p>Thursday- Think about a time you have been to the beach, maybe you have a photograph of you at the beach. Can you draw a picture and write about it? What did you do? What did you see? Who did you go with? How did you get there?</p>	<p>Thursday-The hermit crab wants a new shell, draw a large shell- decorate the shell with a repeating pattern i.e. -red, blue, green, red, blue, green. Can you make a more complex pattern?</p>
<p>Friday- After listening to the story Handa’s Surprise, ask your child to name and draw different fruits that they know. Have you eaten any of the fruits in the story? Label them using describing words.</p>	<p>Friday- Can your child make a repeating pattern using fruits or food i.e. apple, banana, apple, banana. Ask your child to build on the above to create more complex patterns e.g. apple, apple, banana, apple, apple, banana.</p>

TOPIC TASKS - To be completed through the week

Our learning this week is based around the theme of **Around the world Here are some tasks to try.**

Twinkl
There are lots of lovely activities based on Around the world if you want to print any out or use some of the ideas.

Research
Encourage your child to look at the food in your kitchen and find out what countries some of it comes from. You could search on a map for those countries.

Create
Look at flags from around the world. Click here [flags from around the world](#) Discuss which are your child’s favourites and why? Ask your child to design and make their own flag using 2d shapes.

Talk
Spend time talking with your family about places you have been to. You could look at photographs and talk about happy memories you have made.

Build
A bridge helps people move over obstacles like a river, a valley or a busy road. The world’s longest bridge is in China and is 164.8km long. It would take more than two days to walk the length of this bridge. Do you have any bridges near your home? What do they look like?
Try building a bridge out of paper, Lego or any other building materials you might have at home. Your bridge needs to be big enough for a toy car or small toy to travel over.
