<p><b>Monday-</b> Share the story of “The Rainbow Fish”. You can find it here <a href="https://youtu.be/r9mryuEkkKc">https://youtu.be/r9mryuEkkKc</a></p>	<p><b>Monday-</b> Our sound of the week is “Ee”. Listen to the Jolly Phonics song <a href="https://youtu.be/J1ZludcLyi8">https://youtu.be/J1ZludcLyi8</a> Join in the actions and practise saying the sound and writing the sound.</p>
<p><b>Tuesday-</b> After you have finished reading “The Rainbow Fish”, ask your child what happened, ask them to explain it to you. Can they describe the main story settings, events and principal characters?</p>	<p><b>Tuesday-</b> Our sound of the week is “Ee”. Go on a sound hunt around your house and garden. How many things can you find beginning with “Ee”?</p>
<p><b>Wednesday-</b> Build up vocabulary. As you share the story can you look at the pictures and name the different things from under the sea. The grown up could write a list of all the things you name. Can you add any more “Sea” words to the list?</p>	<p><b>Wednesday-</b> Under the sea rhymes and songs <a href="https://youtu.be/DX2Er--LYmQ">https://youtu.be/DX2Er--LYmQ</a> There are lots of songs and rhymes about under the sea. Sing “Baby Shark”, “1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive”</p>
<p><b>Thursday-</b> THINK, SAY, FEEL. Talk about the Rainbow Fish - What might he be thinking? What might he be saying? What might he be feeling? Talk about the Little Blue Fish- What might he be thinking? What might he be saying? What might he be feeling?</p>	<p><b>Thursday-</b> Use water, flour, rice or lentils in a shallow tray or plate. Practise writing sounds using your finger. Practise writing the sounds that you know including “Ee” and your name, you might do this; in the air, on paper, using different colours, in the bubbles of the bath etc.</p>
<p><b>Friday-</b> Ask your child to look at the books you have in your house. Can they find any other books about creatures that live under the sea? Share them together.</p>	<p><b>Friday-</b> Watch Geraldine the giraffe does phonics: <a href="https://youtu.be/rWyKmM-PqJY">https://youtu.be/rWyKmM-PqJY</a>. Now time to log on to Phonics Hero and Phonics Play.</p>
Weekly Writing Tasks	Weekly Maths Tasks
<p><b>Monday-</b> Ask your child to draw a picture from “The Rainbow Fish” and write about their favourite underwater creature. They could label the picture too</p>	<p><b>Monday-</b> Sing “1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive”. Do the actions, using your fingers to show each number. Do it in a loud voice, a quiet voice, slow voice, do it fast, do it in a funny voice etc.</p>
<p><b>Tuesday-</b> Think about the beginning, middle and end of the story. What did The Rainbow Fish do at the beginning, what did he do in the middle, and what did he do at the end? Can you draw the three parts?</p>	<p><b>Tuesday-</b> Draw out 10 fish. Put 1 spot on the first, 2 spots on the second, 3 spots on the third, 4 spots on the fourth, 5 spots on the fifth etc.</p>
<p><b>Wednesday-</b> Play Fish for Sounds - write out some letter sounds that correspond to objects found in the sea -s for sea, f for fish. Try and write them outside in chalk or water or sand and encourage your child to trace over them.</p>	<p><b>Wednesday-</b> Play- Counting Undersea Creature <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/underwater-counting">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/underwater-counting</a> Support your child to create a record of how many of each creature there were.</p>
<p><b>Thursday-</b> Practice writing your name or copy some names from “The Rainbow Fish” Really think about how we hold a pencil correctly and how we form our</p>	<p><b>Thursday-</b> Make your own Fish number line. Draw 10 fish shapes and cut them out. Write your numbers 1-10 on them. Can you say each number? Can you put</p>

letters correctly- over copy, under copy, use a paintbrush, use a stick, giant letters etc.	them in order?
<b>Friday-</b> Listen to the song <a href="#">Henry the Crab</a> - Ask your child to draw a picture of what they think Henry the crab looks like. Can they write a sentence about Henry?	<b>Friday-</b> Name and find some 2d shapes in your house- square, oblong, circle, triangle and star. Can you make your own Rainbow Fish using different shapes- circles, ovals, triangles?

## TOPIC TASKS - To be completed through the week

**Our learning this week is based around the theme of UNDER THE SEA. Here are some tasks to try.**

### **Twinkl**

There are lots of lovely activities based on The Rainbow Fish if you want to print any out or use some of the ideas.

### **Explore Floating and Sinking**

Fill up a bowl, sink or basin and provide your child with a range of objects to explore. Which ones float and which sink? Ask them why they think they float/ sink? Keep a record of the objects that float and sink? This could be using pictures or written.

### **Research**

Go on BBC iPlayer and watch “Andy’s Aquatic Raps” to learn lots of fun facts about different under the sea creatures.

### **Create**

Use a paper plate (or a paper circle) Can you make an under the sea creature? A fish? A crab? A Jellyfish?

### **Make**

Can you either paint your hand to do a handprint or cut out your handprint. What under the sea creature can you make? Fish? Crab? Jellyfish?

### **Pattern**

Draw out a blank fish template. Can you turn it into The Rainbow Fish? How can you decorate it? Colouring/painting/printing/collage.
