<p>Monday- Share the story of “Monkey Puzzle.” You can find a version here https://safeYouTube.net/w/9LHJ</p>	<p>Monday- Our sound of the week is “Hh” Listen to the Jolly Phonics songs https://safeYouTube.net/w/IVHJ Join in the actions and practise saying the sound and writing the sound.</p>
<p>Tuesday- Build up vocabulary. As you share the story can you look at the pictures and name the different things from the jungle. The grown up could write a list of all the things you name. Can you add any more “Jungle” words to the list?</p>	<p>Tuesday- Our sound of the week is “Hh” Go on a sound hunt around your house and garden. How many things can you find beginning with “Hh”? Can you draw some of them and write the sound “h” next to each one.</p>
<p>Wednesday- THINK, SAY, FEEL. Talk about Monkey Puzzle - What might the monkey be thinking? What might he be saying? What might he be feeling? This might change at different parts of the story.</p>	<p>Wednesday- Can you make your own Rainforest sound mat? Choose a sound and draw something from the rainforest that starts with that sound. E.g. S-Snake, T-Tiger. How many sounds can you do?</p>
<p>Thursday- As you read the story of “Monkey Puzzle” try emphasising the rhyme, encourage your child to join in and fill in the final rhyming words. You could make a rhyming list- bat, cat, mat etc.</p>	<p>Thursday- Jungle writing- Using grass, leaves, stones etc can you make “h” in your garden? Can you make a giant “h”? You could get a stick and practise writing “h” in the mud? https://www.doorwayonline.org.uk/activities/letterformation/</p>
<p>Friday- Ask your child to look at the books you have in your house. Can they find any other books about animals that live in the jungle? Share them together.</p>	<p>Friday- Watch Geraldine the giraffe does phonics: https://safeYouTube.net/w/yUHJ Time to log on to Phonics Hero and Phonics Play.</p>
Weekly Writing Tasks	Weekly Maths Tasks
<p>Monday- Ask your child to draw a picture from “Monkey puzzle”. They could write and label the picture too.</p>	<p>Monday- Draw/print out a picture of the mummy monkey. Use positional language (next to, on top of, beside, under, etc) and ask your child to follow the instructions and place the monkey in different positions e.g. put the monkey next to the tree etc</p>
<p>Tuesday- Talk about the rainforest with your child and ask: What can you see? What can you hear? Ask your child to draw a picture of the rainforest and write a sentence about what they can see or hear.</p>	<p>Tuesday- Listen to these 2 songs about positional language https://safeyoutube.net/w/ScT5 and https://safeYouTube.net/w/3IZJ Discuss the songs and the positional language.</p>
<p>Wednesday- Practise writing your name or different jungle words. Really think about how we hold a pencil correctly and how we form our letters correctly- over copy, under copy, use a paintbrush, use a stick, giant letters etc.</p>	<p>Wednesday- Play positional language Hide and Seek- Choose a selection of items and hide outside. Ask your child to count out loud while you’re doing this. Give them clues about the positions of the objects, e.g. it’s under the flower etc</p>
<p>Thursday-Ask your child to create a rainforest animal mask then talk about the</p>	<p>Thursday- The illustrations in this book are beautiful. See if your child can count</p>

sounds that different animals make. Can they write a sentence to describe the animal e.g. *I like the monkey. He is cheeky. He jumps in the trees.*

the different rainforest objects for example how many caterpillars are on the leaf? How many flowers can you count?

Friday- Watch [Go Jettors: Amazon Rainforest](#) Can your child tell you where the tree frog was found? What sound did it make? Which rainforest insect steals the picnic? What happens when the tree frogs aren't there to eat the ants?

Friday- Draw a rainforest number picture. Draw 5 tall trees, 4 long snakes, 3 cheeky monkeys, 2 beautiful butterflies and 1 big elephant.
