Class - Year 3 Around the World

Weekly Reading Tasks

Monday- Read a chapter/few pages of your book to someone, try to read with expression. Can you retell the events verbally or even act it out ?

Tuesday- Visit [Ducksters](#) and read some information about the continent of Europe. You could then choose a European country to learn about, look out for information about major cities, rivers and landscapes.

Wednesday- Listen to this story from Brazil called 'Where the night came from'. Can you use bullet points to write down the main events of the story?

Thursday- Have a read through these [riddles](#) - can you work out what is being described?

Friday- Visit [Story Nory](#) and choose a story from around the world to listen to. Can you summarise the main events by drawing a comic strip?

Weekly Writing Tasks

Monday- Visit <https://www.pobble365.com/around-the-world>, look at the picture and read the Story starter! box. Can you use your imagination and continue the story ?

Tuesday - Log onto Purple Mash and type 'country fact files' into the search bar. Choose a country which you would like to know more about, then research some information. Then use your information to fill in your fact file. (To be completed by Friday 3rd July.)

Wednesday- Visit the Literacy Shed for this wonderful video of [The Blackhat](#), a story by Maia Walczak. After watching the video can you write a description of the boy's home in the woods. Remember to add lots of detail, you can use your imagination too.

Thursday- Linking to yesterday's video can you design and draw a magic hat with a different power. Don't forget to explain the power of your hat and what would happen if someone puts the hat on their head.

Friday- Write your own story based on The Blackhat, you could use your own magical hat which you created yesterday. You could hand write or type your story

Weekly Spelling Tasks

Monday- Can you learn how to spell the names of the seven continents like you have done previously? Can you write some sentences with these words?

Tuesday- Grammar - Use [this lesson](#) to learn about expanded noun phrases. There is a video an activity and a quiz to try.

Wednesday- Complete one spelling quiz on Purple Mash in your Alerts section. (To be completed by Friday 3rd of July).

Thursday- Practise the names of the continents from Monday, ask someone to test you. Choose some of the Year 3/4 [Common Exception](#) words and use different colours to divide the words into syllables

Friday- Practise a spelling rule on [Spelling Frame](#). Go to **Year 3 and 4**, choose a spelling rule and click **play**. Click on **spelling tiles** and choose an activity

Weekly Maths Tasks

Monday- Use [this lesson](#) to practise how to multiply and divide by 0, 1, 10 and 100. There is a video, two activities and a quiz to try.

Tuesday- Use Hit the Button, Timetables Rockstars and [Daily 10](#) to practise multiplication and division facts up to 12x12. Which times table are you the most confident with? Which ones do you need more practise on ?

Wednesday- - Make a multiplication flower for a times table of your choice like the one [here](#)

Thursday- Watch these videos of [3x](#) and [8x](#) table songs Choosing a times table of choice, can you make a song of rap or poem to help remember the multiplication facts linked to this time table

Friday- Pirate Challenge - *Four pirates want to sail to an island. There are two female pirates and two male pirates. The boat will only hold two women or one man. How can all four pirates get to the island ? (You might want to make a*

model to help you.)

TOPIC TASKS - To be completed through the week

Our learning this week is based around the theme of Around the World. Here are some tasks to try.

Virtual Explorer - What are the continents of the world? Where are they located? What languages are spoken in these continents? Ask your child to use Google Maps to explore a continent of their choice. Can they create a continent fact file or choose a particular country they are interested in and create an information guide including the weather, tourist locations, landmarks, weather, traditional music, food, flags

Dance Around the World - Use [SafeYoutube](#) to dance along to some different cultural dances from around the world, such as the Brazilian Samba, the traditional Diwali stick dance or the Spanish Flamenco. **Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.**

Marvellous Maps Log onto Purple Mash and complete these quizzes in you Alerts section : World Continents, World Oceans, European Countries (you might want to use a map to help you on this one). To be completed by Friday 3rd July.

Speak the Language - Discuss with your family the links that you may have to the wider world. Find out places family members have visited on holiday, work/business links or simply countries they would like to visit in the future. Have a go at learning some simple phrases in different languages from around the world.

Explore the Galápagos Islands - Use [this lesson](#) to learn all about the Galapagos Islands. There are two videos some written information and a then a quiz to try.

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There are many different religions followed and celebrated all over the world. Use the websites below to explore some of the teachings and traditions of these religions. You could create an information booklet or PPT to show what you have learnt.
