Look at the three words below (or choose your own from a book you are reading) - record what you think the meaning of the words is, find the dictionary definition of the word, give an example sentence using the word, find synonyms (word with the same/similar meaning), antonyms (word that has the opposite meaning)
appreciate, guarantee and occupy.

Wednesday-

Wednesday-

Can you complete this [prefix challenge](#) from Talk for Writing? You can then choose 5 words and apply them into different sentences.

Thursday-

Weekly Maths Tasks

Monday- Research

By the end of this week you will have written diary entries or post cards from different places you are going to imagine you have visited. Today you need to do some research to choose the three places you want to base your writing on. It could be somewhere you have always wanted to visit, somewhere you should have been visiting this year but unfortunately now can't or one of [these](#) amazing places that have virtual tours you can take.

Monday -

There are two Maths 2dos set on Purple Mash - Timestable Quiz and Rounding Spreadsheet. Complete with hand in by Friday.

<p>Tuesday- Planning Now you have chosen your destinations you need to do some planning - more research on these specific places. Think about each place you have chosen - what is it famous for? What would you be able to see/hear? What food would you eat? Is it relaxed or action packed? If you were writing to someone back home - what would they be interested in hearing about? Make notes to help with your writing.</p>	<p>Tuesday- Practise column multiplication and short division with these missing digit games. Can you make your own versions? Or Play multiplication war with a member of your family with a deck of cards. Flip two cards over and multiply. Whoever has the highest product keeps the cards. Think about what the inverse division fact would be. Use 3 cards as a challenge.</p>
<p>Wednesday- First draft Have a go at writing your three entries. Remember diary entries or postcards are quite chatty and informal. You still need to remember to vary openers, use a range of punctuation and try not to repeat the same vocabulary.</p>	<p>Wednesday- Compare number facts and figures between different countries. This could be the size of a county, the population of a country, the temperatures of different countries, comparing currency in different countries.</p>
<p>Thursday- Finish first draft and edit Once you have finished your three paragraphs (or entries/postcards), have a look back through and see if there is anything you can improve. Maybe an adult could check for spelling mistakes and you could look them up, or you might notice that your sentences begin with the same word, or there might be punctuation missing. Editing your work in a different colour helps you to see the changes you have made.</p>	<p>Thursday- Test your times table knowledge by finding the products and factors in this game. Can you work through all of the levels?</p>
<p>Friday- Final draft Write up your final draft - this could be on postcard template or in a diary of yours if you wish. Try really hard with your handwriting, making an extra effort to join your writing. Remember by the end of Year 6 your writing needs to be joined!</p>	<p>Friday- White Rose Hub - Challenge Friday Have a go at some of these challenges - they get trickier as you go through!</p>

TOPIC TASKS - To be completed through the week

- **World Geography on Purple Mash-** You have been set some 2dos on Purple Mash so you can show off your Geography skills. Have a go at completing some of them - hand in by Friday so I can see what you have been up to. You might need to do some research on certain areas in order to complete the task.
- **Flags of the World-** Flags are a national symbol for all countries. Cultures use different symbols and colours on their flags which are meaningful to them and represent their history and people. Pick 5 countries and investigate their flags. What symbols and colours have they used? Why are these significant to this country? Can you create a flag for the St Teresa's which you feel represents us best?
- **Tastes of the World-** Children all around the world eat a variety of food and many of the foods we eat today are inspired by other countries. Can you research and make a dish (with an adult) from another country which you have not tried before?
- **International Games-** As part of the London 2012 Olympics a variety of countries were asked to name a traditional game which represented their culture and traditions. These can be seen [here](#). Research these games and take inspiration from them to design your own game. Think about how the game is played, how you win and what equipment is needed. Where possible, you should test your game and make any changes needed.

- From Irlam to Johannesburg- Think about what it would be like to live in another country. Do you think your life would be the same or completely different? Use [these](#) following clips to compare living in Greater Manchester to somewhere else in the world. Make a list of similarities and differences and think about how your life would change.
- Exploring the World- Throughout history many people have explored new places. You can find out about some of them [here](#). Pick an explorer from the list or one of your choice. You could map out the places that the explorer visited or create a piece of art inspired by the places they visited. You may wish to write a diary entry from the explorer's point of view to share what they have seen and experienced

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There are many different religions followed and celebrated all over the world. Use the websites below to explore some of the teachings and traditions of these religions. You could create an information booklet or PPT to show what you have learnt.
