



Weekly Reading Tasks	Weekly Phonics Tasks
Monday- Sing the nursery rhyme ‘Wheels on the Bus’ with your child. Can they add verses about different modes of transport? What sounds and actions do other kinds of transport make?	Monday- Our sound of the week is “Gg” Listen to the Jolly Phonics songs https://safeYouTube.net/w/IVHJ Join in the actions and practise saying the sound and writing the sound.
Tuesday- Share together, ‘You can’t take an elephant on the bus’, you can find it here https://safeYouTube.net/w/io0M . Ask your child which animal they would like to take a bus journey with and why.	Tuesday- Our sound of the week is “Gg” Go on a sound hunt around your house and garden. How many things can you find beginning with “Gg”? Can you draw some of them and write the sound “g” next to each one?
Wednesday- Follow the story The Bus is for Us with your child. Ask them to recall the different types of transport mentioned in the story. Can they recall any of the rhymes?	Wednesday- Go on a long walk, keep your eyes and ears open for different kinds of transport. Ask your child to listen to the sounds each mode of transport makes. Discuss the rhythm and volume of each sound
Thursday- Tell your child that they’re going on an imaginary journey. What do they need to take? Play the memory game - ‘I packed my bag and in it I put a...’ Take it in turns and keep adding to the list. Each time repeat the whole list.	Thursday- Rhyming sounds. Think about some kinds of transport and make rhyming lists. How many words can you think of that rhyme with car- write a list. How many words can you think that rhyme with van-write a list. What about train?
Friday- Listen to ‘ The Naughty Bus ’. Can you child use a bus toy to retell the story? Maybe they could use another mode of transport and create their own story!	Friday- Watch Geraldine the giraffe does phonics. https://safeYouTube.net/w/Js6M Time to log on to Phonics Hero and Phonics Play.
Weekly Writing Tasks	Weekly Maths Tasks
Monday- Ask your child to draw pictures of different types of transport and label them and their parts. For a challenge, ask them to sort them into water, air and road.	Monday- Have a look a car number plates, what numbers do you recognise? Go for a walk on a number spotting hunt. Look at the numbers you can see on car number plates, on bus stops, on the front of the bus.
Tuesday- Ask your child to draw a picture of them with their chosen animal on the bus, or another mode of transport. Can they write about why they’d like to go on a journey with that animal?	Tuesday- Let’s work on writing our numbers. You can write them, paint them, chalk them inside or outside. You can make your own number plate for your bike, your scooter etc https://www.doorwayonline.org.uk/activities/letterformation/
Wednesday- Ask your child to write about why they like different modes of transport, just like in the story. For a challenge, see if they can make some lines rhyme too!	Wednesday- Addition getting on the bus. Draw a bus with 10 windows. Make up a number story for adding a different person each time. For example -The lion got on the bus then were 2, the tiger got on the bus then there were 3 etc. Add one character each time until there are 10 characters on the bus.
Thursday- Imaginary journey-where would your child go? Why would they go there? What would they do there? They could draw out their imaginary land and	Thursday- Subtraction getting off the bus. Line up 10 toys who are sitting on the bus. Make up a number story for taking one away each time. “Now there are 9,

label it with describing words.	now there are 8 etc.” Take one toy each time until there are none left.
Friday- After using their toy to create their own story, can they write the story down? They could draw pictures too, or even take photographs!	Friday- There are lots of rhymes and songs that help us to count back one each time. Have fun singing these together- “Five little men in a flying saucer.” https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p065rfng

TOPIC TASKS - To be completed through the week

Our learning this week is based around the theme of **TRANSPORT** Here are some tasks to try.

Make Paper Planes

Make some paper aeroplanes, try Googling this for different styles. Ask your child to come up with a name for their airplane and write this on the side, alongside some decorations. Have a competition to see whose airplane will fly the furthest/ highest. You could ask them to create a certificate for the winner.

Physical

Play the traffic light game- Ask your child to help create a set of traffic lights. This could be as detailed_or simple as you like. Ask your child to run around the garden/ outdoor space. When you point to a colour on the traffic light, they have to do the following: ○

- Red- Stop or freeze where they are
- Orange- Walk slowly
- Green- Run

You could extend this by adding in different colours or actions e.g. when you bounce a ball on the ground, they have to jump up and down.

Science

Brilliant Boats • Collect different materials from around your house. Paper, yoghurt pots, cereal boxes, tinfoil cake tins. Which objects make the best boats? Which boat will carry the most coins or marbles?

Learn to Ride a Bike

Support your child in learning to ride a bike. If they are already a confident rider, they could set up and complete an obstacle course to help develop their control or they could have races to improve their speed.
